

MORNING AND EVENING DU‘Ā’ - UNIT SIX

It is narrated from Ibnu ‘Umar, may Allāh be pleased with them both [‘Abdu l-lāh and his father, ‘Umar] that he said: The Prophet, may Allāh blessings and peace be upon him, never used to leave these words of supplication when he would come upon the evening and when he would come upon the morning:

**al-lāhumma ‘innī ‘as’aluka l-‘afwa wa l-‘āfiyah, fi d-dunyā wa l-‘āakhirah, al-lāhumma ‘innī
‘as’aluka l-‘afwa wa l-‘āfiyah, fi dīnī wa dunyāy, wa ‘ahlī wa māli, al-lāhumma stur ‘awrātī, wa
‘āmin raw‘ātī, al-lāhumma ḥfaznī min bayni yadayy, wa min khalfī, wa ‘an yamīnī, wa ‘an shimālī,
wa min fawqī, wa ‘a‘ūdhu bi ‘azamatika ‘an ‘ughtāla min taḥtī.**

**‘O Allāh, I ask you for pardon and salvation in this dunyā and the ‘āakhirah. O Allāh, I ask you for
pardon and salvation in my religious affairs, worldly matters, family dealings, and wealth. O Allāh,
hide my shortcomings and save me anguish. O Allāh, protect me from what is in front of me, behind
me, on my right, on my left, above me, and I take refuge in Your greatness from being suddenly
destroyed from underneath me.’**
